



On behalf of Perry County Public Library we invite you to participate in this free challenge which encourages you to read 100 books before your high school graduation.

CHALLENGE OVERVIEW

The concept is simple, read a book (any book), and the goal is to have read 100 books (yes you can repeat books) before you graduate high school. Does it sound hard? Not really if you think about it. If you read just 1 book every two week, you will have read about 25 books in a year. That is 100 books in four years!

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- Keep track of the titles of the books that you read with our 100 Books Before Graduation Challenge on our Beanstack app or website perrycountylibrary.beanstack.org.
- Make sure to keep a record of any book that you read.

FREQUENTLY-ASKED-QUESTIONS

- Who can participate in this challenge? Any student 9th-12th grade can participate in the 100 Books Before Graduation Challenge.
- How long will the challenge take? It will take anywhere from a few months to a few years. This is self-paced and will depend on how often you read.
- What books count? Simple any book! Yes, graphic novels and audio books are real books too!
- What if I don't read all 100 books? You do not have to finish reading all 100 books. Just give it go and we will celebrate what you do read.
